
Mellers Primary S	School Governors' Blog
27 <sup>th</sup> March 2019	Following the greater depth interviews with year five and six children, Lesley Lyon gave feedback to the leadership team, 27.3.19. Discussion focused on the language used with children and parents regarding those working at or towards greater depth and how they know this. This will be explored further in a staff meeting, leading to an updated more able children policy and a more consistent approach in how we share this information with children and parents. The leadership team are going to explore the possibilities of challenge or enquiry after school clubs in different subject areas. A group of children will be given the task to design a library area, funded by the P.T.A. next academic year.

Wednesday 13th March 2019	During Governor Monitoring Week last week, it was a privilege to interview a selection of pupils from Years 5 and 6.  At the last Pupil Progress Meeting Governors discussed the progress made by our cleverest pupils. As a result, we decided to find out for ourselves by talking to those pupils aiming for a Good Level of Development across the school. To this end, I met with the pupils in Year 5 and 6.  I asked them the following questions: How clever do you think you are?
	How do you know how clever you are?  Does your family know how clever you are? In lessons, do you get the chance to do harder work?  Do the questions the teacher asks you make you think deeply?  Are there more opportunities you would like to extend your ability/knowledge even more?  Their responses were fascinating and I learned a lot. They would really like a school
	library with more challenging books, they and their families would like more information about their ability and they would really like to go on beyond 'The Deeper Question' to 'The Impossible Challenge'!!!!  As a result of this work the governors will be bringing back responses to the Leadership Team so that they can work out a plan of action to address the ideas and issues raised by the pupils. Wednesday 5th December 2018	I spent the day, as part of our Governor monitoring week visiting every classroom in the school. The focus of my visit was to look at how well our most able children are supported and challenged in the classroom although in doing the activity, it was great to see all children on task and enjoying their learning.
	In Year 6, they are studying the novel Journey to the River Sea. As a secondary school English teacher, I could have been watching a lesson for Year 8. The children were discussing the different character types in the novel using words such as protagonist, antagonist, dynamic and many more. They were being constantly asked to justify their answer and look for evidence from the text in support of their opinions.

I saw Year 5 in Maths, alongside 3 other teachers who were visiting from local schools to learn from the good practice at Mellers. They were being encourage to work systematically through the problem solving exercise - a word they clearly understood. The children demonstrated a language of mathematics and an enjoyment and curiosity in their learning. Year 2 were studying World War 11 and asking questions about the feelings of the soldiers in the trenches. They showed empathy and understanding. The Year 3 Art lesson showed children learning how to blend colours and an understanding of what a silhouette is. In the other Year 3 class children were learning about adverbial sand conjunctions. I could write so much more but the things I picked up were that the learning of children was building year on year and I could see skills developing from the early years through to year 6. The teachers and teaching assistants worked together to support learning. Work in the books were beautifully presented and the behaviour for learning was excellent. Friday 7<sup>th</sup> December Popped into Y4 today as part of Governor's monitoring week. I saw some fantastic 2018 Writing as well as inventive and interesting Maths. Loved it. Monday 3 December Excellent visit today. Accompanied the Headteacher on learning walks to observe 2018 Key Stage 2 classes. Started by admiring the fabulous World War 1 exhibition that was taking shape near the Staff Room. The theme continued in all of the KS2 classes. Some fabulous work and the children were totally absorbed by the topic. Year 6 were particularly impressive with their enquiring minds and analysis of the reliability of source material. The shoebox WW1 trenches were also fantastic and it was great to see the excellent community spirit with many parents coming in to work with their children on the project. The children obviously loved what they were doing and told me what life must have been like in the trenches, particularly the rats and trench-foot! Monday 26th As Governors, we have a responsibility to ensure that all staff are supported in November 2018 their professional development and personal well-being. In particular, this extends to our Newly Qualified teachers. To this end, I accompanied Mrs Patel to the classroom of our NQT to watch while she did an observation. We observed the children on the carpet having a discussion and following a busy sequence of activities where children were engaged in reading, role play and coordination and shape activities. I was pleased to learn that our NQTs are mentored very closely and have a range of opportunities to participate in training as part of the Transform Reaching Alliance as well as other training offered by the Local Authority. Our NQT told me 'I feel really well supported at Mellers. There is always someone to help with planning and give me good advice about how to organise the learning. I have enjoyed my first term at Mellers. It has been hard work but good'. I felt happy that our Newly Qualified Teacher would develop into a good teacher for the children.

Thursday 22 <sup>nd</sup> November	Met with Sarah Elliott today for a catch-up on her role as SENCO. We had a walk round school and observed some of the SEND children in their classes which was very useful to help my understanding. We also discussed how best to track the SEND and Pupil Premium budgets in relation to progress of individual children.
Tuesday 12th November	On Tuesday 12th November Sharon Pratt, parent governor, and I met with Miss Dawson to review the school progress and set her new targets for this academic year. We were joined in the meeting by Carol Norman who is the ex Headteacher of Welbeck School. Her role was to advise Sharon and myself as to whether Miss Dawson and the leadership team have made good progress.
	We are pleased to report that the targets for last year were met and exceeded in most cases. We discussed the progress of the most able children in school and were especially pleased with excellent results particularly in reading and writing.
	We walked all-round the school to look at the standards of display in school. We were pleased to see some wonderful displays on a range of subjects, which celebrated the work of children and stimulated conversations and interest. Last year, after the new build walls were white and bare. The displays are now vibrant, colourful and informative. We were very impressed.
	The final target was to provide support for another school that was experiencing difficulties. Miss Dawson and our Mellers team visited the school and advised how to make improvements in English and Maths and how to assess and track the progress of pupils. This was much appreciated by the school and their results were much better because of this valuable work. Our team from Mellers also learned much from providing the support which has improved our own practice. We then set some new targets for this year which are based on improvements in maths, research into new and innovative teaching methods which will make our pupils into more curious learners and to ensure that our pupils are well supported as the school continues to grow.
	As governors, Sharon and I felt privileged to be advised by our external advisor that the school is making excellent progress and whilst there are always improvements be made Miss Dawson is leading us to becoming an outstanding school.
