Library Visit

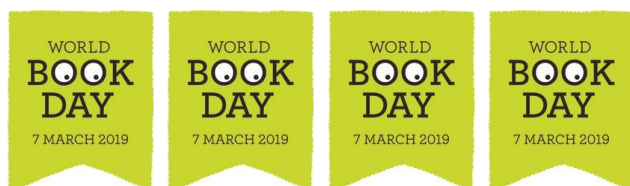
Year 2, River Leen class, will be visiting the library next Wednesday afternoon.
