2019 SATs Success

We're absolutely thrilled with our Y6 SATs results again this year, they've gone from strength to strength putting us above national levels once again.

- ♥ Reading 86% pupils at the expected level, 29% above
- ♥ Writing 81% of pupils at the expected level, 21% above
- ♥ Maths 79% of pupils at the expected level, 21% above
- ♥ Spelling, grammar and punctuation 79% of pupils at the expected level, 39% above
